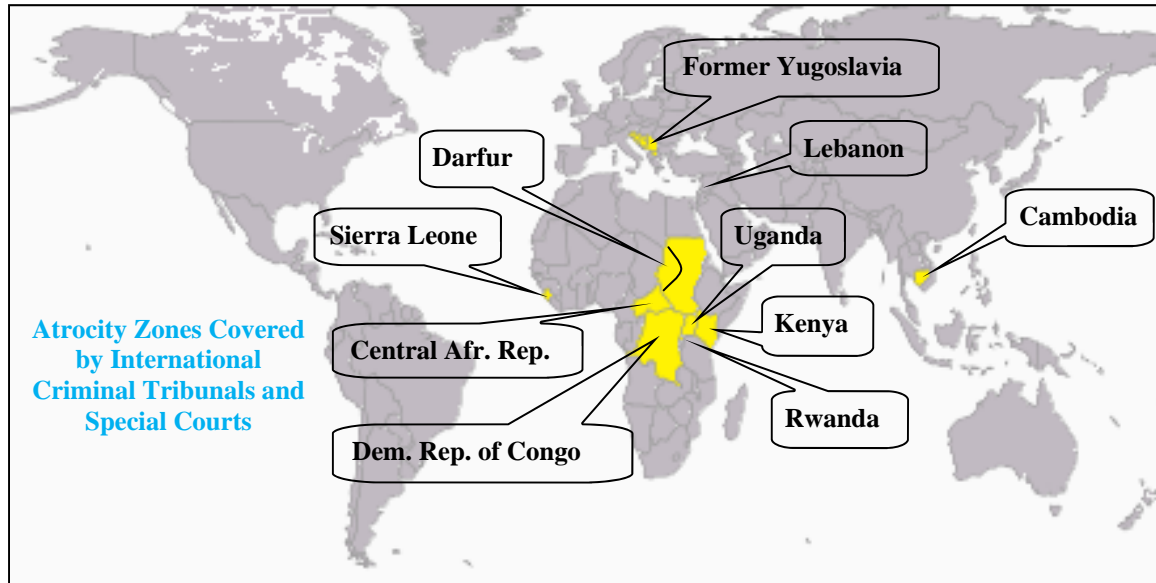

The 2009 decisions and judgments of the International Criminal Tribunals for the Former Yugoslavia and Rwanda, the Special Court for Sierra Leone, the Extraordinary Chambers in the Courts of Cambodia, the International Criminal Court, and the War Crimes Chamber of the State Court of Bosnia and Herzegovina, as well as developments at the Special Tribunal for Lebanon, will be discussed by eleven leading practitioners and scholars of the tribunals: Prosecutor Serge Brammertz (ICTY), Judge Erik Møse (ICTR), Deputy Prosecutor Fatou Bensouda (ICC), Defense Counsel Courtenay Griffiths (SCSL), Registrar David Tolbert (STL), Defense Counsel François Roux (ECCC and STL), Prosecutor David Schwendiman (B-H), Civil Party Counsel Alain Werner (ECCC), Prof. Göran Sluiter (Univ. of Amsterdam), and Prof. David Scheffer (Northwestern Law & former U.S. Ambassador at Large for War Crimes Issues). Amb. Christian Wenaweser, President of the ICC Assembly of States Parties, delivers the Luncheon Keynote Address. Journalists Roy Gutman (McClatchy) and Christine Spolar (Huffington Post) join the evening discussion.
